



## 2<sup>nd</sup> MOBILITY for ERASMUS+ Project 2020-1-ESO1-KA229-082556\_3

### “Walking together towards an Egalitarian Europe”

During the week 7<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> March 2022 the 2<sup>nd</sup> mobility of the project took place in the town *La Trinité*, Martinique, France. Each partner took part with the following teachers and students:

On 6<sup>th</sup> March 2022 the groups were welcomed by the French teachers Marieta MISAINÉ and Raymond PETIT-FRÈRE and were taken to their accommodation by bus.

On 7<sup>th</sup> March 2022 an introduction to the history and culture of the island was made with a guided tour along the south coast of the island. Everybody admired the *Rocher du Diamant*, the *Mémorial Cap 110* dedicated to a sunken slave ship at *l'Anse Cafard* and the picturesque town *les Anses d'Arlet* with a Regional Marine Park of great natural importance.

On 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022, the International Women's Day was celebrated at the premises of Collège Beauséjour in an official ceremony that honoured Jane LÉRO, first president of Women's Union in Martinique together with all the local women who fought for freedom and equal rights. Guest speakers included members of local feminist associations and significant female personalities who talked about their work and answered questions concerning the role of their gender in their social and professional life.

Lunch was offered at school. In the afternoon, there was a unique visit to the Gardens and the Cultural Centre “*Le Fondation Clément*”.

On 9<sup>th</sup> March 2022, the groups went on exploring the north part of the island through the tropical forest and the protected zone of rivers Blanche and Alma with two important stops at *Sacré-Coeur de Balata* and the seaside town of *Saint Pierre*, the richest and most important town in Martinique before its total destruction by a volcanic eruption in 1902. They visited the ruins of the theatre and went around the old city.

On 10<sup>th</sup> March 2022, at school the students had the opportunity to get to know each other through drawing and dancing activities organised by the Art teacher and the Music teacher.

At the same time, the partner teachers of the 4 schools had their project assembly.

a) They reviewed the activities already assigned. One activity which had not been completed by two schools was agreed to be presented during the next mobility.

b) They organised the activities for the next mobility in Greece on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2022. On the 15<sup>th</sup> May being the International Day of Families, the partner schools are going to look into family roles and relationships through the activities assigned. They also agreed to repeat last year's questionnaire on family roles with new groups of students and discuss the results in the following mobility.

c) They discussed the special features of the current mobility given the long distance of the French school from its European partners. The fact that local students seemed very enthusiastic about meeting their peers from partner schools was highlighted. The French school also prepared an evaluation questionnaire in terms of education outcomes and organisation matters to be completed by students and teachers who took part.

When they were ready, the randomly mixed groups of students presented the posters on stereotypes they had discussed and drawn. Then, they performed the folk dances they had practised. The atmosphere was really warm and enjoyable so everybody joined in and the activity turned into a multi-cultural party.

In the second part of the school day and according to schedule, i) the schools would present the projects on women's inventions they had prepared in the 2<sup>nd</sup> term, ii) there would be a kahoot game on this topic and iii) the results of questionnaires on men/women's inventions (answered by teenagers, parents, grandparents, teachers) would be discussed. Unfortunately, there was a network problem that could not be solved and because of no internet connection this part of the schedule could not be carried out. The Greek group, however, had prepared a scene from the ancient comedy *Lysistrata* by Aristophanes, with the first female lead in a comedy in western culture. They performed a very simple but symbolic choreography on men-women's relations. The day finished with a meal at the seaside village *Tartane*.

On Friday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2022, kayak practice had to be cancelled due to weather conditions so the groups were taken to the beautiful area of *Les Trois-Ilets* and spent a relaxed morning there. The delicious farewell lunch at the hotel restaurant was offered by the French school. The certificates of attendance were given on that very emotional but also cheerful occasion. Promises were made to keep in touch until the next mobility.
